

A further search of Mr. Fredericks' person was conducted by Officer Woodley, who recovered an additional magazine from Mr. Fredericks' rear left pocket. Mr. Fredericks was then placed in the rear seat of a marked police vehicle pending further investigation. Contact was then made with Brian Roberts, owner of the Beehive Strip Club, who confirmed that Mr. Fredericks had been banned from the establishment and was not permitted on the property.

At approximately 0402 hours, Forensic Crime Scene Technician (CST) D. Mahoney arrived on scene and photographed, documented, and collected the firearm and magazine as evidence. The firearm was identified as a black Sig Sauer P320 9mm handgun bearing serial number 58J240006. The firearm contained a magazine loaded with sixteen (16) rounds of 9mm ammunition and one (1) round in the chamber. The additional magazine recovered from Mr. Fredericks' rear left pocket contained seventeen (17) rounds of 9mm ammunition. A records check revealed that Mr. Fredericks did not possess a valid Virgin Islands license to carry a firearm. Mr. Fredericks was advised of his constitutional rights and transported to the Richard Callwood Command, where he was photographed, booked, and processed. The defendant was later turned over to the Bureau of Corrections pending his Advice of Rights hearing scheduled for Monday, June 15, 2026. Bail was set at Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). He was unable to post bail.

The defendant should be charged with the following:

1. Possession of an Unlicensed Firearm (14 V.I.C. § 2253(a))
2. Possession of Ammunition Without a License (14 V.I.C. § 2256(a)(3))
